


How do children in West Africa live?

They are just like you are, but the way they live is very different! Many of them live in villages, where they sleep in huts made out of mud and straw. They have to be careful during the rainy season, because many times the rain causes these mud houses to fall down! Most of them have a lot of brothers and sisters, so they have a lot of company when they are out in the fields working for most of the day. Few children are able to go to school. Those that are able to go to school often just have a notebook and copy everything from the blackboard.







What do children in West Africa eat?

Most of their meals consist of a base covered in a delicious sauce! The base usually consist of rice, noodles, potatoes, or a local specialty (such as tô or fufu). The sauce can be made out of anything, such as peanuts, onions, leaves, or tomatoes. Then they throw a little meat into the sauce, like beef, lamb, pork (for the non-muslims!), or fish. Sometimes, they get to eat special things, like grasshoppers, termites or even caterpillar sandwiches! They like their food extra spicy!



What do children in West Africa do for fun?

Those that live near lakes love to swim, as long as they watch out for the crocodiles and hippopotamuses that live there. Because most children cannot afford to buy nice toys, they often make their own out of whatever old pieces of garbage they can find.





How do children in West Africa learn about Jesus?

Romans 10:17 says «So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.» These children learn about Jesus the same way you do: by hearing the word of God. But sadly, most children do not have the opportunity to hear God's word because there are few people there who know the truth and can share it with them. Many of these children do not even know who Jesus is! When they do hear the Gospel, God can do a great work in their lives. That is why it is so important that some of you go to West Africa to tell them about Jesus! Children that do go to Sunday school don't do it like you. They often just sit underneath a tree on large straw mats, listening with great attention to Bible stories they have never heard before. Sometimes, there will be special camps or VBS at the church and they can hear about God for several days in a row! Who will go to tell these children about Jesus Christ?








There is presently a land in great danger. The people there worship in shrines and pray to wood and stone idols for many occasions. The people do not go to church, and most of them have never been to church before.



FACING FEARS FROM SOUTH AFRICA



Since living in South Africa, I've seen people face some pretty incredible challenges despite the fear they had. Extreme activities are easy to find. Have you every been on an airplane? If so, where you nervous when you were first taking off? Let me ask you this? How would you feel about jumping out of that airplane at 10,000 feet. My son and I had that opportunity to sky dive. It was scary but also incredible. How do you feel about bungy jumping? Did that too:). But there is a catch. I didn't just bungy jump, I bungy jumped off the tallest bungy bridge in the world. It was over 700 feet high. That's more than two football fields long. Let me tell

People from all over the world come to South Africa for a one of the most thrilling and scariest things you could ever do.....cage diving with Great White sharks. I took two of our college interns to dive with the scary beast and it was something I'll never forget. Those sharks were so close and so very big.

While I've been in South Africa I have faced some pretty scary things. Bungee jumping, sky diving, cage diving with Great White sharks, you would think those have to be three of the scariest things you've ever done. To tell you the truth, those things were pretty scary, but you know what's scarier sometimes? Standing up for Jesus Christ. I regularly knock on people's doors to invite them to our church, but also to tell them about Jesus. Asking someone these questions is many times scarier than jumping off the world's highest bungee bridge: If you died today, do you know where you would go? Have you trusted Jesus as your personal Savior? Talk about scary. Swimming with sharks is scary, but



trying to share the Gospel many times is even more scary. The Bible says in Isaiah 41:10 Fear thou not; for I am with thee: Be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; Yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness. God doesn't want us to live a life of fear. He wants us to trust Him. How are we supposed to conquer our fears? It's pretty

Our fear may not go away totally, but the hard part is over. Take the first step to knock on someone's door. Take the first step and hand someone a Gospel tract. Don't be controlled by your fears.
